Annie Jeffrey Health Fair Slated for Oct. 1

A nnie Jeffrey Memorial County Health Center is pleased to announce details about our 20th Annual Fall Health Fair. This year's event will be held at Annie Jeffrey Memorial County Health Center on Tuesday, October 1st. This year's event will have some on-site information available along with discounted blood draws, flu shots, and free skin analysis evaluation.

The health fair will be held at *Annie Jeffrey Memorial County Health Center in Osceola*. If you are experiencing cold or flu symptoms including but not limited to fever, coughing and/or shortness of breath, if you or a member of your family have traveled from an area where COVID-19 is spreading or if you or a member of your family have been in close contact to or exposed to someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19 we ask that you do not attend the health fair. This year's event will be held from 6:45 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. Annie Jeffrey Health Center will be providing comprehensive blood screening profiles including general blood chemistry analysis, cholesterol profile, and complete blood cell count at a discounted rate of \$35 (a \$315 value). Thyroid screening (TSH), diabetes screening (Hemoglobin A1C), Vitamin D, and prostate specific antigen (PSA) testing will also be available for \$25 per each additional test requested. All participants who want a blood test are asked to not eat or drink 8-12 hours before the test. You are encouraged to drink as much water as possible to keep hydrated and to take your medications as you usually do. Please bring a self-addressed, stamped legal sized envelope so that your test results can be mailed directly to you.

The Comprehensive Blood Screening Profile provides information on your body's ability to fight infection along with helping identify health issues such as but not limited to anemia, diabetes, heart disease, some clotting disorders, cancers, and liver disease.

Medicare versus Medicare Advantage

hen you first sign up for Medicare and during a certain time of the year, you can choose or change how you get your coverage.

There are 2 main ways to get Medicare:

• Original Medicare is a fee-forservice health plan that has two parts: Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Part B (Medical Insurance). After you pay a deductible, Medicare pays its share of the Medicare-approved amount, and you pay your share (coinsurance). If you want Medicare drug coverage (Part D), you can join a separate Medicare drug plan. You can use any doctor or hospital that takes Medicare, anywhere in the United States. In most cases, you don't need a referral to use a specialist. To help pay your out-ofpocket costs you can buy supplemental coverage. Medicare covers most medically necessary services and

supplies in hospitals, doctors' offices and other health care facilities. You can join a separate Medicare drug plan to get Medicare drug coverage. In most cases, you do not need approval from Original Medicare to cover services or supplies.

• Medicare Advantage (also known as "Part C") is a type of Medicare health plan offered by a private company that contracts with Medicare. These plans include Part A, Part B, and usually Part D. Plans may offer some extra benefits that Original Medicare doesn't cover. Your decision about how to get Medicare affects how much you pay for coverage, services you receive, and qualifying doctors. In many cases, you can only use doctors who are in the plan's network. You may need to get approval from your plan before it covers certain drugs or services and plans may have higher out-of-pocket costs than original Medicare.

Foundation for Annie Jeffrey ANNUAL REPORT

For our Fiscal year – July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024

he Foundation for Annie Jeffrey is a non-profit corporation organized to provide funding for projects (such as new medical equipment or facility renovations) that promote health care in the communities served by Annie Jeffrey Health Center. The Foundation is governed by a nine-person volunteer board. The hospital foundation keeps track of funds which are donated and for what purpose they are donated; seeks grants and other outside funding; provides tax reports to the IRS; recognizes donors in newsletters and on our Wall of Commitment; helps publish quarterly newsletters; plans fund raising events; and participates in numerous hospital and clinic activities. Donations to the Foundation qualify as tax-deductible charitable gifts.

Here is a recap of the past years events and activities.

In August, the *Foundation* paid \$5,027.06 for a new Infusion Recliner with proceeds from our golf tournament.

In September, the *Foundation for Annie Jeffrey* kicked off its annual campaign to raise money to purchase a new Chemistry Analyzer for the lab. At their February meeting, the *Foundation for Annie Jeffrey* Board of Directors voted to donate \$91,100 from their annual campaign to Annie Jeffrey Health Center to purchase a new Chemistry Analyzer.

The Annie Jeffrey Volunteers celebrated their 28th anniversary in November.

The annual Foundation Family Tree Celebration was held in December. Funds raised from this event were used to help fund new equipment. This event allows community members to purchase ornaments to hang on a Christmas tree at Annie Jeffrey Health Center to remember and honor loved ones.

The *Foundation* received a \$6,000 donation from the Annie Jeffrey Volunteers at their annual Christmas Party. The Annie Jeffrey Volunteers run the Thrift Shop in downtown Osceola and donate their proceeds to help the hospital pay for special items. They have donated over \$141,000 over 28 years to the hospital. Annie Jeffrey Health Center honored the Annie Jeffrey Volunteers with a brunch and program in April.

In February, the *Foundation* held their annual Wine & Beer Fest fundraiser at The Rose Colored Glass in Stromsburg. The money raised from ticket sales and the silent auction helped with the annual campaign.

In April, the *Foundation* helped sponsor Mature Driving Classes at Annie Jeffrey Health Center. These 8 hour classes usually cost over \$300 to take but was offered free to the community.

Twice this year, we were fortunate to have Boutique 29 Eleven offer their clothing at Annie Jeffrey Health Center with a portion of their proceeds donated back to the *Foundation*.

The Foundation for Annie Jeffrey awards scholarships to the following high schools: Shelby/Rising City High School, Cross Country High School, Osceola High School and High-Plains High School. The winners of this year's Foundation for Annie Jeffrey scholarships are: Makayla Quilhot, Shyanne Anderson and Emma Roberts. These scholarships are in addition to the scholarships offered to Annie Jeffrey employees. Since 2012, the Foundation for Annie Jeffrey has awarded 56 scholarships to kids in Polk County with some of those students returning to work at Annie Jeffrey.

Annie Jeffrey Health Fair Slated for Oct. 1 Continued.

The thyroid screening, TSH, measures a thyroid stimulating hormone that tells if your thyroid is working too hard or not hard enough.

The diabetes screening, Hemoglobin A1C, measures your average blood sugar for the past 2 to 3 months. This test provides a much better indication of long-term glucose control than a blood glucose.

Vitamin D screening provides a baseline Vitamin D level which is important since insurance companies will not cover this screening unless you are pre-diagnosed with a deficiency. Vitamin D deficiency presents a silent danger, it has been linked to several different illnesses and conditions including osteoporosis, respiratory diseases, high blood pressure, depression, fatigue, mood changes, psoriasis, muscle weakness, bone pain, and kidney problems.

The prostate cancer screening, PSA, measures a prostate specific antigen in men. This protein produced by the prostate gland tells men information about their prostate health.

The Polk County Health Department will also be on site offering seasonal flu shots. Regular flu shots will be available to fair goers for \$35. The Polk County Health Department will also have High Dose Flu shots available for \$76 for individuals with Medicare Advantage and Railroad insurance plans. These are recommended for individuals 65 years of age and older. They will be available at no cost for fair goers with a current Medicare Part B card, this does not include Medicare Advantage or Railroad plans. Donations will be accepted by the health department to help cover the expense of administering the immunizations.

The Four Corners Health Department will also be on site offering free blood pressure checks. They will also have their skin scope available to provide a free skin analysis evaluating damage caused by the sun.

We hope you choose to take control of your health by attending the Fall Health Fair on October 1st. Reminder no appointment is necessary that walk-ins are welcome for lab work and flu shots from 6:45 am until 11:00 am. Individuals are encouraged to call 402-747-2031 and ask for Robin to address any questions or concerns.
